We will honor Clever Crazes for Kids Founder and CEO Dianne Dunkelmann with the third Zonta Club of Cincinnati Marian de Forest Award and hear from the Ann Rasche and other Zonta scholarship recipients. Susan Johnson from Susan’s Auction Service will serve as auctioneer for the live auction and keep things moving throughout the evening. The Midnight Rose Trio will provide musical entertainment. The Zonta Club of Cincinnati, through the Zonta Service Fund of Cincinnati, Inc. (the club’s non-profit 501 (c) 3 arm), has been providing Ann Rasche Scholarships to non-traditional female students in the Greater Cincinnati community for many years. Ann Rasche was a member of the Zonta Club of Cincinnati for 26 years and worked for Cincinnati State Technical and Community College for 24 years. The Ann Rasche Scholarship was established in her honor upon her death in 1998. Recipients are selected by Cincinnati State according to the

following criteria established by the Zonta Club of Cincinnati: Tri-State women 25 years of age or older with limited financial resources just entering or returning to school after a significant break in her formal education, currently enrolled in a degree program at Cincinnati State Technical and Community College and seeking her first degree. Ann Rasche Scholarships are awarded each year to deserving women striving to improve their lives and that of their families.

Other educational and scholarship programs available through the Zonta Club of Cincinnati in conjunction with Zonta International include the Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships, Young Women in Public Affairs Awards, Amelia Earhart Fellowships, and the Women in Technology Scholarships. The Zonta Club of Cincinnati's scholarship and service programs are funded through donations and fundraisers. Direct scholarship donations can also be made via the Zonta Club of Cincinnati's website.

In addition to their scholarship programs, the Zonta Club of Cincinnati has also raised and provided funding to support service projects with Bethany House Women's Shelter, Tender Mercies, First Step Home, Women Helping Women, and FamiliesFORWARD. The Zonta Club of Cincinnati, along with other District 5 clubs in Ohio, Kentucky, and West Virginia, also annually assemble birthing kits for third world countries.

Advocacy efforts include co-sponsoring Women Helping Women's Purple Light Walks to raise awareness about domestic violence and their *She Screams Without Sound* Candlelight Vigils honoring victims of domestic violence, human trafficking awareness efforts, and Cincinnati for CEDAW (Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women),

The Zonta Club of Cincinnati was chartered in 1935 and is a member of Zonta International. Founded in 1919, Zonta International is a global organization of professionals working together to empower women worldwide through service, education, and advocacy. Zonta International has consultative status with the United Nations as a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO).
