Founder's Day - November 21st Dinner Meeting, 6pm

Please bring a guest to the Founder's Day Membership Dinner Meeting on Thursday, November 21 at the Clovernook County Club, 2035 Galbraith Rd, 45239. This will be Zonta's 100 birthday celebration complete with birthday cake and a birthday present for every member! This will be a very special evening for our club and a huge celebration for Zonta International.

District 5 Conference October 18-20

Seventy-seven Zonta members from around Ohio, Kentucky, and West Virginia converged on Defiance, Ohio for the 2019 District 5 Conference on October 18-October 20. Hosted by the Zonta Club of Defiance, this was a voting conference and our very own Connie Kingsbury was elected Area 2 Director! President Melinda Hepfner was the Delegate and President-Elect Melanie Hoffman was the Alternate representing ZCC. Treasurer Lori Burkhardt, D5 Foundation Ambassador Ellen Spaeth, members Terri Purtee-Stein, Donna Seitz, and Jane **Wiehe** (who brought the club's newborn kit supplies) also attended.

The Conference began on Friday evening with a welcome reception and dinner followed by a short business meeting and a welcome from the Mayor of Defiance. Afterwards speaker Monica Kelsey, founder and owner of Safe Haven Baby Box, talked about their program and their work with the Zonta Club of Defiance to install a baby box for abandoned babies at the Defiance Fire Station - the first such installation in Ohio.

Saturday's agenda included delegate voting, and the Presidents breakfast where it was decided that it was the Zonta Club of Cincinnati's turn to host the Area 2 meeting on Saturday, 3/21. Delegates adopted a proposed change



to the District 5 Bylaws to charge young professionals under the age of 30 half price for D5 membership dues to align with the ZI program. Delegates also approved donating \$2,500 to the Centennial Anniversary Endowment Fund in Past International President Eleanor Jammal's honor, which will be made on 11/8/19 in honor of Zonta International's centennial anniversary. Keynote speaker and retired helicopter pilot Elizabeth McCormack gave a dynamic presentation entitled You in the Pilot's Seat. ZCC members Melinda Hepfner and Jane Wiehe were recognized as First Timers. There were also workshops on Building Your Own Platform by Zonta member Chelsea Ceneghin and Mind Your Own Story. Mind Your Behavior presented by Zonta member and D5 Leadership Development Committee Chair Maile Doyle.

The following District 5 clubs received Zonta International Centennial Grants to present to their service and advocacy partners in their communities.

- Ashtabula The Beatitude House focuses on education for disadvantaged women and children. They serve all women and children bound in the cycle of poverty and homelessness.
- Cleveland Renee Jones Empowerment provides holistic restorative services for minor and adult human trafficking and sexual assault victims by empowering these individuals to advocate for themselves and to improve their quality of life through personal, social, and professional development.
- Columbus The S.O.A.P. (Save Our Adolescents from Prostitution) Project provides hands-on outreach to fight sex trafficking at large events and in communities. Their focus is on educating and increasing public awareness on the prevalence of human trafficking in order to restore trafficked survivors and to prevent teens from being victimized by domestic, minor sex trafficking.

Saturday evening's festivities began with group photos, the parade of presidents, and dinner. The evening ended with a birthday bash, the always popular silent auction and karaoke (where our own **Donna Seitz** sang Let There Be Peace on Earth), and the Governor's reception.







Sunday morning began with a Memorial Service remembering the District 5 Zontians who have departed this past year (including **Joan Mettey** and **Pauline Strayhorne**, who were remembered by Ellen and Donna) followed by D5 committee and Governor's reports. Attendees participated in the hands-on, district-wide service project by assembling 100 Newborn Kits. **D5 Service Committee Chair Keri Dunn** will take them with her to distribute on her company's upcoming trip to Liberia early in 2020. The conference concluded with invitations to the 2020 Zonta International Convention in Chicago, District 5 Governor's 2020 Fall Meeting in Elizabethtown, KY, and the 2021 North American Interdistrict Meeting in Cincinnati. D5 ZIF Ambassador Ellen Spaeth collected \$28,900 in donations, and the Silent Auction netted \$1,925 for District 5.

October 24 Membership Dinner Meeting

At the 10/24 dinner meeting, **Connie Kingsbury** was installed as a Director on the Service Fund Board, and **Vicki Yeazel** was installed as Secretary on the Zonta Club of Cincinnati Board.

Keynote speaker **Samantha Searls**, Program Manager for Intercommunity Justice and Peace Center (IJPC) delivered a presentation focused on human trafficking and immigration. She will send her PowerPoint presentation to share with the entire club.







September 26 Membership Dinner Meeting

At this first dinner meeting of the new ZCC year, member **Jean Beirise** was installed as a Director on the Service Fund Board, and **Lynn Brown** was installed and welcomed back to the club as a returning member. **Terri Purtee-Stein** gave an update about the October 4 Purple Light Walk. Club members approved the expenditure of \$25 for the 9/27 Womans City Club Expo. **Glenda Carota** summarized the results of the 8/22 Ales & Advocacy – those involved agreed that member participation was down from the 2018 event





and hope to go back to the March timeframe for 2020. Members agreed to bring back the Split the Pot fundraiser and to have another small fundraiser at each membership meeting to help fund guests at dinner meetings.



- New: SubCommittee Chair Mary Clare Hill (mhill@zonta-cinti.org; 513.519.1113) for both new projects presented at the September dinner meeting.
 - o Mats for Homeless Women Mary Clare presented this new service project at our 9/26 dinner meeting. The mats are crocheted, knitted or woven using plastic grocery bag strips called *plarn*. They are soft, easy to clean, light weight, and measure 3 feet by 6 feet. Volunteers are needed to: Collect bags (500-700 per mat), make the plarn, and construct the mats.





comfort to women who are living in harsh conditions. There will be a yellow Zonta rose woven into each mat, to remind the women that we as Zontians care about them. Mary Clare also e-mailed a YouTube video to all ZCC members with instructions on how to cut the strips to make the plarn.

o **Letters of Love** – These letters are for expectant mothers through the Cradle Cincinnati project, which was founded in 2012 to address the very high infant mortality rate in Hamilton County, which is in the top 10% mortality rate of communities in the entire country. The majority of our infants who die are born to single mothers who report that they don't have the social or emotional support they need. We are invited to write letters of encouragement that will be hand-delivered to women during their prenatal doctor appointments.

Letters can be long or short as long as it's from the heart. Encouragement is the key word here. These women don't need long lists of advice; they simply need to know somewhere in Cincinnati, someone is rooting for them. If you are a mother, feel free to share personal experiences with pregnancy, postpartum depression, being a single mom, or having a premature baby. Sharing a personal story of strength is a great way to inspire someone else. These letters aren't just for first-time mothers; all pregnant women could use a little love. Sign your letter with just your first name. Recipients won't know anything else about you. Please don't seal the envelope. Members' Letters of Love can be brought to Zonta meetings and Mary Clare will deliver them to Cradle Cincinnati. If you are unable to bring your letters to meetings, please contact Mary Clare and she will pick them up.

• Birthing & Newborn Kit Assembly – SubCommittee Chairs Dawn Trammell & Jane Wiehe On July 13 ZCC members gathered along with former ZCC member Shirley Alsup Bacon (she is a newly wed!), and volunteers who assembled 50 birthing kits and 145 newborn kits. Our new distribution partner, FAME, is headquartered in Indianapolis so Dawn and Jane headed there on July 24th, to drop off the kits!

FAME was even more excited that our kits came so nicely bagged, boxed, and labeled. Dawn and Jane had lovely conversations with Lisa in reception; Lonnie, Shirley's friend who is in charge of volunteers heading off on medical mission trips; and Tyler and another gentleman from the warehouse. Our main contact is Barry Reed, who is director of the warehouse. Unfortunately,



med students from Purdue arrived at the same time as we did, and the students were meeting to give a 45-minute presentation. Barry later emailed to apologize for not being able to meet us.

Jane received an email from Barry indicating that kits are being held up in Indy for the Haitian Christian Outreach clinic because of all the unrest in that country. However, the pastor of a local Indy church stopped by to pick up ultrasound gel for equipment recently acquired for a Liberian medical clinic. In their conversation, he learned the focus of the medical clinic is birthing and newborn care. So, some of the supplies will go there. He also said, "We expect to have a much larger relationship with this mission in the months and years to come."

We will see how this initial shipment of supplies goes, and we hope to learn and share more specific info with members about this mission. Jane included the info about Haitian Christian Outreach and their medical clinic in the form submitted to FAME. Dawn and Jane believe we can expect more information as to the impact of our kits in the months ahead and enjoy a growing collaboration with FAME.

A huge thank you to all for your continued support of time, talent, and treasure for this project!

Advocacy Projects:

• 3rd Annual Human Trafficking Youth Prevention Summit: Social Media Toolkit, Friday 11/22/19
This event, hosted by Senator Teresa Fedor (D – Toledo), Senator Stephanie Kunze (R – Columbus), and Representative Tavia Galonski (D – Akron), will be an interactive experience to educate high school students on human trafficking. In addition to educating high school students, they are collaborating with university student anti-human trafficking organizations to make this day entirely youth-focused. This year, the event will cover topics including social media, safety, self-esteem, and health. The event will also be highlighting the role of students and young people in the fight to end all forms of trafficking. The day will be interactive, including breakout discussions and other student-led activities.

In addition to attending, they are asking that we share this educational opportunity with students that you represent or work with by sending the registration information and link to schools in your district. Registration is required for participation and lunches will be provided for all students and teachers present. They hope we will lend support to this event and in doing so help elevate awareness of this important issue. Let's show the state how students, educators, legislators, and citizens stand together to tackle the major issue that is human trafficking. Our children are our future, and we must do all that we

The 32nd annual vigil at the Hamilton County Courthouse was held on Tuesday, 10/22. Zonta has had a presence each year along with Women Helping Women and the YWCA. It was a moving memorial for domestic partners who have been killed by their partners and a candle was lit for each one by a family member or friend. **Glenda Carota, Cindy Feucht, Terri Purtee-Stein, and Candas Stacey** attended. It was a beautiful service and a reminder that these ladies are not forgotten. We had our Zonta Says No banner to show our support.



• Purple Light Walk - SubCommittee Chair Terri Purtee-Stein

The 7th Annual Purple Light Walk (PLW) was held on Friday, October 4 on Fountain Square. There was a good crowd turnout for the event. The PLW mission is to raise awareness about gender-based and domestic violence. There was dancing to celebrate survivors and the Resource Fair consisting of 13 non-profit organizations who had tables with information for both survivors and victims.
